Proof of the following Completed Immunizations are required before enrolling:

- Varicella (Chickenpox) – Must show proof of 2 dates or Varicella Titer
- Hepatitis B Series or Hepatitis Titer – Must show proof of 3 dates
- T.B. Skin Test and Date – Negative or Positive (within the last year)
- Tetanus
- MMR (Measles, Mumps, and Rubella) – Must show proof of 2 dates
- Flu Shot (within the last year)

(You should be able to go to your local health department for these immunizations.)
