selective service registration (males); proof of US citizenship.

You can obtain background check, & drug screen paperwork once tuition is paid and all requirements are met.

Proof of the following completed immunizations are required before enrolling:

- Varicella (chickenpox) must show proof of 2 dates or varicella titer
- Hepatitis B series or Hepatitis titer must show proof of 3 dates
- TB skin test & date negative or positive (within the last year)
- Tetanus
- MMR (Measles, Mumps, & Rubella) must show proof of 2 dates
- Flu shot (annual flu vaccine)

Your local health department should be able to administer these.
